

THE CALIFORNIA DELTA

The Fresno Bass Club's fourth stop for 2022 was the California Delta. The Delta is known for its population of large bass that lurk in its vast canals and waterways. April is also known as the time to catch big bass as they prepare for the spawn.

This year the weather has been up and down and of course this month's tournament was no exception. We had some beautiful weather leading up to tournament week before a cold front and storms pushed their way through the area on Thursday and Friday.

I drove up on Thursday with Jimmy Arnold and just as we made the westbound turn onto Highway 12 the skies opened up on us with large rain drops accompanied by heavy winds, but by the time we made it to B&W, the winds had subsided, and the rain was letting up. We parked in the parking lot and after about twenty minutes we were able to get out of the truck and don our rain gear and proceed to rip some lips.



The rest of the day was cloudy and pretty much calm except for a couple of 10–15-minute bouts of rain and hail mixed in together. One would think the fishing would be tough, but it was quite the opposite. We proceeded to catch fish all day long as we fished north of B&W. We caught several top-water fish and drop shot fish all day long.



Friday the bite was a little tougher, but the clouds were still lingering, and I think that helped keep them biting. We had continued success throwing drop-shot and senkos, but the top water and reaction bite totally disappeared for us. We still managed a few good ones on Friday, but after that, the bite for us got really tough!



You guys all know that pre-fishing is over-rated, and it never fails, tournament day everything changes. A few guys were still catching numbers and quality, but most of the field struggled to catch a limit and if they got five, most limits didn't even break the 12 lb. mark.

But you know, it doesn't matter how tough it is, a few in the field will always figure them out and this month was no different.

This month's Fresno Bass Club Champion is Danny Marshal. "Delta" Dan is no stranger to finding and catching big fish at the Delta. A matter of fact he has been sticking it to us for a few years now, he has this place figured out.

Danny said he caught his fish bed fishing "back channels with calm water" with a drop shot and jig. The behemoth bucket mouth was caught by Danny using a four-inch Pro Gold Purple Flake worm that he cast to the fish as she was swimming down a weed line. Congratulations Delta Dan on an outstanding win and taking home all the moola!!



Second place went to the always consistent bride's maid, Corey Squires. Corey is pretty tight lipped about how he catches his Delta fish. From what I could get out of him, he was fishing super slow with a wacky rigged 5"senko somewhere down south which means he was probably fishing a reaction bait in Franks Tract, who knows??? Great job Corey!




